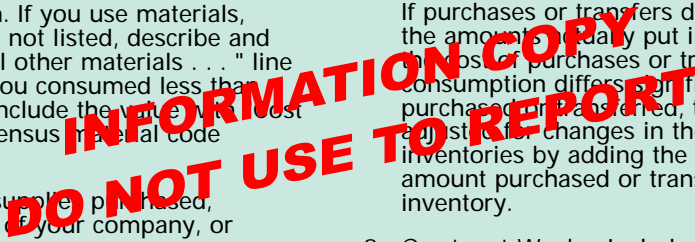
Materials received from other plants within your company should be reported at their full economic value (the value assigned by the shipping plant, plus the cost of freight and other handling charges).

If purchases or transfers do not differ significantly from the amounts already put into production, you may report the costs of purchases or transfers. However, if consumption differs significantly from the amounts purchased or transferred, these amounts should be adjusted for changes in the materials and supplies inventories by adding the beginning inventory to the amount purchased or transferred and subtracting ending inventory.

3. Contract Work – Include as materials consumed those you purchased for use by others making products for you under contract. Amounts paid to the companies doing the contract work should be reported in item 10, line e, and should include freight in and out. On the other hand, materials owned by others but used at this establishment in making products for others under contract or on commission should be excluded.

4. Resales – Cost for products bought and sold or transferred from other establishments of your company and sold without further manufacture, processing, or assembly should be reported in item 10, line b, not in item 17 below. The value of these products shipped by this establishment should be reported in item 18B under Census product code 99989 00 6, "Resales."

2. Valuation of Materials Consumed – The value of the materials, etc., consumed should be based on the delivered cost; i.e., the amount paid or payable after discounts and including freight and other direct charges incurred in acquiring the materials.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. General – This section covers establishments primarily engaged in knitting, dyeing, or finishing weft or warp fabrics, including lace goods; and establishments primarily engaged in knitting items from yarn or in manufacturing items from knit fabrics produced in the same establishment. 2. Structure of the Report – This section is comprised of four parts. In part I, column (D), manufacturers, jobbers, or contractors should report the quantity of all knit fabrics produced in this establishment regardless of intended end use. For all other items, manufacturers, jobbers, and government contractors should report in parts I-III; and contractors should report in part IV. In part I, report the quantity and value shipped of greige fabrics from this establishment. In part II, report the quantity and value of fabrics shipped that are either knit and finished in this establishment, or that are purchased as greige goods and then finished in this establishment. In part III, report the value of shipments of garments and other knit end products. In part IV, report contract and commission receipts, miscellaneous receipts, and resales.

3. Imported garments

- a. "9802" (formerly "807") garments
Include garments cut in the United States which were sent abroad for sewing and then imported back into this country under the provision of item 9802 (formerly 807.00) of the Tariff Schedules of the United States.
- b. Exclude finished garments which are imported (but see "9802" above).

4. Definitions –

- a. Valuation of Products - Report the value of the products shipped and services performed at the net selling value, f.o.b. plant to the customer; i.e., after discounts and allowances, and exclusive of freight charges and excise taxes.

If you transfer products to other establishments within your company, you should assign the full economic value to the transferred products; i.e., include all direct costs of production and a reasonable proportion of all other costs and profits.

- b. Resales - Products bought and sold or transferred from other establishments of this company and sold without further manufacture. Report in part IV only.

- c. Wholesaler - Buying and reselling finished garments without further manufacture.
- d. Importer - Importing and reselling finished garments without further manufacture.
- e. Manufacturer - Making products from materials they own.

Note: Multiplant apparel companies that cut and sew apparel in separate plants of the company should treat the sewing plants as contractors to the cutting establishment.

- f. Jobber - Having items made for them by U.S. contractors. Follow instructions for manufacturers; report as though the products were made in this establishment.
- g. Contractor - Making products for manufacturers or jobbers from materials furnished by them.

Note: government contractors, who make products for the State and Federal Government with government-furnished or their own materials, should report as a manufacturer.

- h. Sizes
Men's and junior boys' - Include all men's and junior boys', preps' (cadets), and students' sizes. These usually include: boys', junior boys', and preps' sizes 6-20, chest 22-36 and waist 23-30, and students' sizes chest 35-42 and waist 28-36.

Little boys' - Include little boys' sizes 4 through 7 and toddler boys' sizes 2T through 4T.

Women's, misses', and juniors' - Include all women's, misses', and juniors' sizes. Include all size runs which are designed to fit adult women.

Girls' - Include girls', subteen, and teenage girls', usually sizes 7 through 16. Include little girls' sizes 4 through 6X and toddler girls' sizes 2T through 4T.

Infants' - Include all garments sizes 0-24 months.
